

Analysis of evaluations received for Stroke Services – Celebrating the first year of our HASU 24th July 2012

92 people were booked for this event including staff and those who were manning 10 different stands. 72 attended the event which is which is a very good level of attendance. Of this number 26 evaluation forms were returned which equates to a 36 % response rate.

This was the first time I have implemented equality monitoring in line with the new E&D requirements for a member event and of the 26 forms received 24 completed the equality monitoring form, 1 partially completed and only 1 person did not complete any of the equality monitoring. This is very positive and an encouraging result as we need to progress with equality monitoring across the Trust. It has also proved useful in the analysis.
